

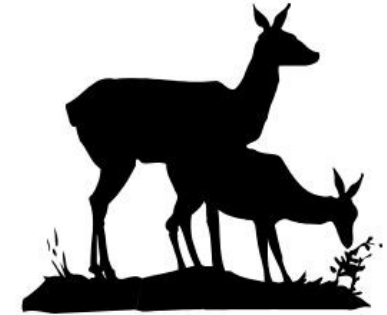

Deer will eat anything if hungry enough, and fawns are notorious for nibbling all sorts of plants when learning what to eat! However, if you fill your garden with plants that are more or less distasteful to deer, they will soon decide to go elsewhere when they are out for a snack.

Use this guide when choosing plants for gardens that share space with local deer, always being mindful of your specific climate area and other environmental conditions when making your selections. Listings include both common and scientific names where appropriate.

Many of the plants listed here will do fine in coastal climates, but the ones in **bold letters** are known to be particularly hardy.
